



The inter-disciplinary study of my ancestral background combined the history of European Jewry with genealogy, genetics, and onomastics to produce an outline of the inter-marriages of many prominent families and their migrations across the continent. It has enabled me to trace my family back for many hundreds of years. As far as photographic records are concerned, the material presented herewith adds some colour to the family history of the past two centuries, depleted as it has been by the ravages and upheavals of the period.

My great - grandparents, who lived in Galicia when it was a province of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, were Rabbi David Isaac Gelles & Sarah Horowitz of Narayow, Rabbi Zvi Aryeh Weinstein of Solotwina & Gittel Horowitz, Eliezer Griffel of Nadworna & Sarah Matel Chajes of Kolomea, and Shulim Wahl & Sarah Safier of Tarnobrzeg. My grandparents were Rabbi Nahum Uri Gelles & Esther Weinstein and David Mendel Griffel & Chawa Wahl. My parents were Dr David Gelles & Regina Griffel of Vienna. I was their second son - my elder brother Ludwig perished in the second world war.




### My Father

Dr David Gelles was born in 1883 in Austrian Galicia to an old rabbinic family. He left the Munkacz Yeshiva in Hungary to seek a secular education, eventually becoming Dr Juris of the University of Vienna and a successful advocate in that city. From his student days he was an ardent Zionist and was prominent in some of its organisations in Austria and elsewhere. He married Regina Griffel of another ultra orthodox Galician family in 1921. David and Regina fled to England with their children in 1938 to escape the Nazis. He and his family acquired British nationality in 1948. My father later returned to his advocate's practice in Vienna where he died in 1964.

The photograph with my father dates from the early 1950's. I was at a boarding school at Cheshunt near Potters Bar in 1939-40. My parents and I spent two years together in Oxford where I went to the City of Oxford High School and took my School Certificate. We returned to our Bayswater flat in 1942 when my mother took a job with the BBC World Service Polish Section. I went to Haberdasher's Aske's School, Hampstead for my A levels, prior to winning an open scholarship to Balliol College Oxford in 1944. I came back to London six years later with an M.A. and D.Phil (Oxon). In the following years I was a research fellow and lecturer in physical chemistry at several Universities.

My mother's parents were David Mendel Griffel, son of Eliezer Griffel, the head of the Jewish community of Nadworna, and Chawa Wahl of Tarrnobrzeg, who was a descendant of the 16<sup>th</sup> century Katzenellenbogen Chief Rabbis of Padua and Venice. Their scion Saul Wahl (1545–1617) played a semi-legendary role in Polish state affairs and had a distinguished progeny.

My great-grandfather Eliezer Griffel was a wealthy entrepreneur with substantial oil and timber interests stretching far beyond his base in Galicia. The outbreak of the first world war turned Galicia into a battle field and led many Jewish families to seek safety in the imperial capital of Vienna.

### My Mother

My mother Regina Griffel was born at Nadworna in 1900 and died in London in 1954. The photographs of my mother are from the 1920's. The second photo shows her with my brother Ludwig when he was about 3 or 4 years old.









Holiday photo at unknown location in Austria around 1933 showing my brother and me standing in front of our mother



### Uncle Max & Cousin Elsa

My uncle Dr Max Gellis was my father's younger brother. He wrote a definitive commentary on Austrian Company Law and was an outstanding amateur chess player, some of whose matches are recorded in the international chess literature (see "Family Chess Notes" by Edward Gelles on the internet). His daughter Elsa, born in 1929, was taken out of Austria on the "Kinder Transport", with Max following to England some months later. Elsa and her mother went on to the U.S. while her father's journey took him to Australia (with my brother Ludwig), back to post-war Vienna, and finally to Tel Aviv where his sister Lotte had lived since the 1930's.



### Aunt Lotte

Lotte Gelles was a younger sister of my father. She was a Dr Juris of Vienna University as were her brothers David and Max. She married twice, firstly a Dr L. Ostrer who was a lawyer in Vienna, and secondly the physician Dr K. Kallman in Tel Aviv.






### Cousin Edythe Rothenberg



My father's elder sister Bertha Gelles went to America on her own in 1910 and married a bookstore owner, Nathan Resnik. One of their children was Edythe (on right) who married Murray (Moshe) Rothenberg. They had two sons, Stuart and Robert.

Edythe's first (Resnik) cousin was Ofira Resnikov (1936-1993), who was born in Israel. She became an academically qualified psychologist and "Miss Israel" Beauty Queen. In 1963 she married the politician Yitzchak Navon (1928-2015) who was of notable Sephardic descent. He became 5<sup>th</sup> President of Israel in 1978 and Ofira contributed to the success of his presidency in many ways as the much admired "First Lady" of Israel.














